

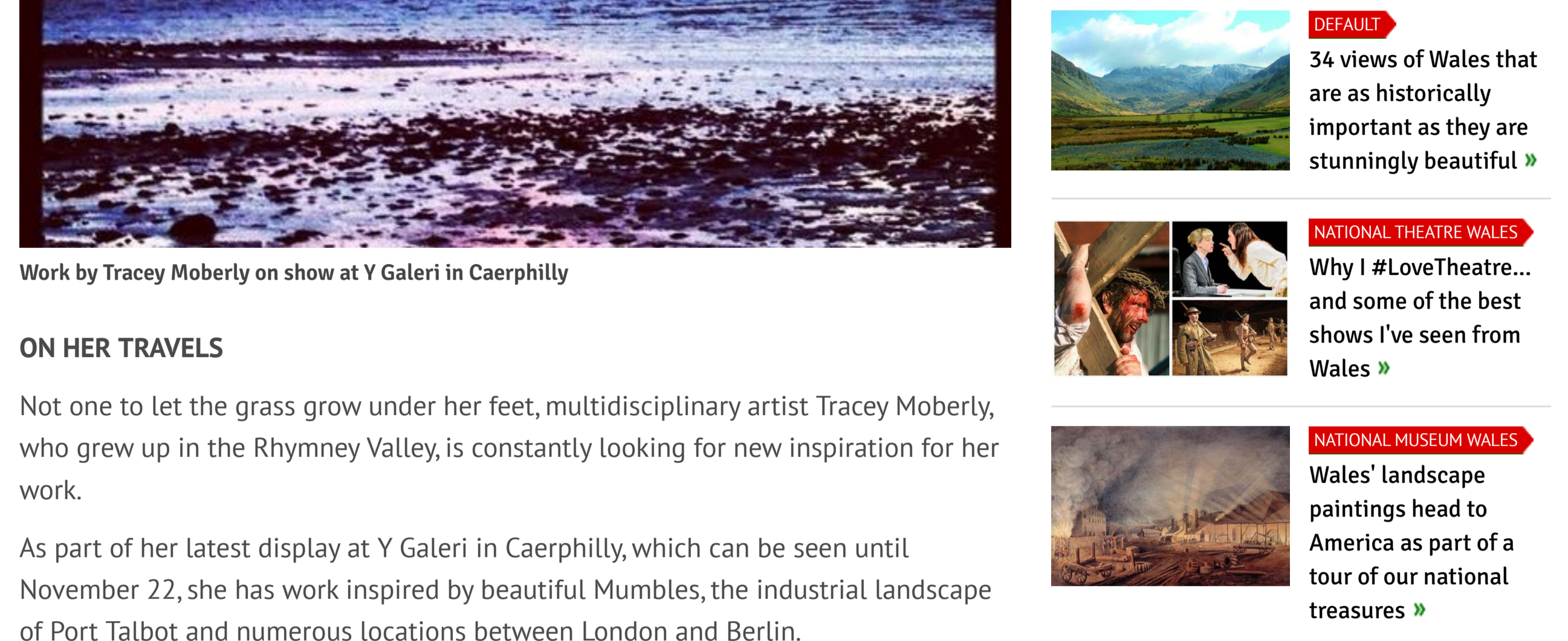

As part of her latest display at Y Galeri in Caerphilly, which can be seen until November 22, she has work inspired by beautiful Mumbles, the industrial landscape of Port Talbot and numerous locations between London and Berlin.

One of her future art projects will take her even further afield to the North Pole and her Arctic training is already underway in readiness.

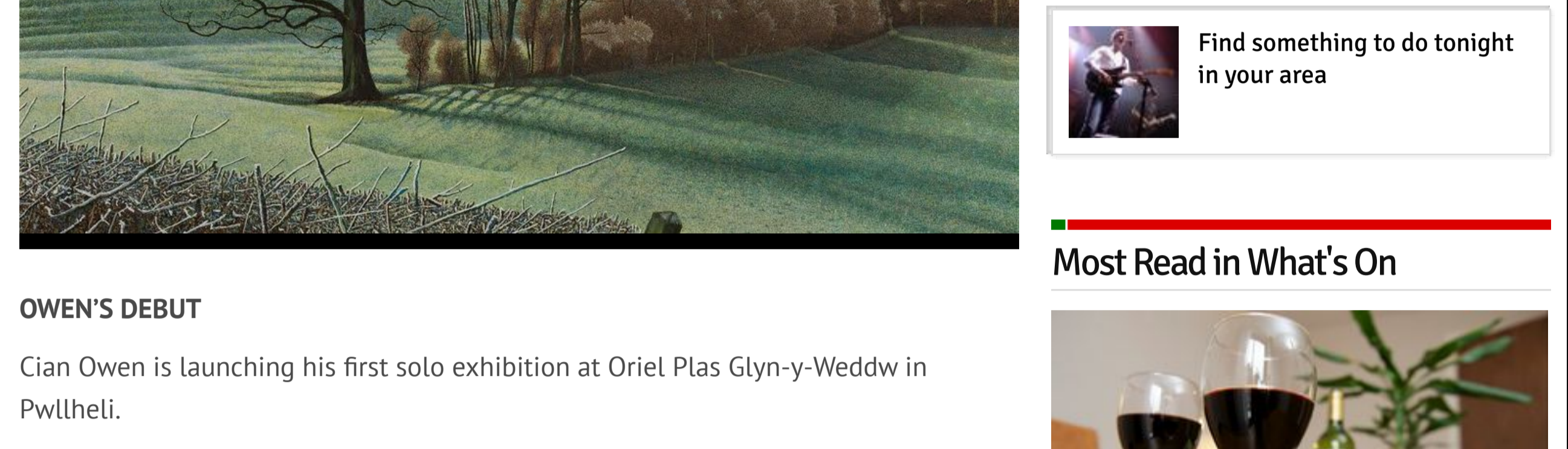
FESTIVE FOCUS

John Cahill joins The Waterfront Gallery in Milford Haven in time for their Big Christmas Arts & Crafts Show, which opens today and runs until December 31.

Known for his large landscapes and etchings of Pembrokeshire, he is displaying his work alongside artists like oil painter Bob Royston and Mark Raggett, who is known for his abstract and semi-abstract work.

There are also acrylic seascapes from Chris Prosser, oil and pastel work from Sandra Phillips and watercolour and mixed media from John Phillips.

Impressionist work comes from award-winner Anne Farrall Doyle and on a smaller scale are Cynthia Morgans Hurley's watercolour sketches and Janet Llewellyn with her black and white paintings. John Houser has just delivered new oil on board local landscapes and Dorian Spencer Davies has painted highly coloured local scenes. But these are just the tip of the iceberg...



OWEN'S DEBUT

Cian Owen is launching his first solo exhibition at Oriol Plas Glyn-y-Weddwn in Pwllheli.

Owen, who suffers from autism, graduated in Fine Art from Cardiff Metropolitan University earlier this year.

Since a very early age, Owen has been engrossed in art and not a single day passes without him creating a painting.

His first exhibition feature some of his graduating work and creations made in his favoured 'stick-men' style.

The exhibition opens on Sunday.

BEAUTIFUL CERAMICS

Eleven graduates from BA and MA courses across the UK are showcased in a new exhibition.

New Graduates in Clay, celebrating the future of ceramics, is at Nantgarw Chinaworks Museum until January 4.

The emerging artists explore the boundaries of clay through sculpture, the domestic, the decorative and jewellery.

"It is a great pleasure for us to be able to present this exhibition of works by newly-graduated artists in a setting that celebrates the heritage and tradition of working with clay," says Lowri Davies, one of the organisers.

IN THE SQUARE

It's your last chance to see the work of three artists - William Oxe, Eddie Wainwright and Serena Phillips - this weekend.

The trio are displaying their paintings at Gallery In The Square in Usk until Sunday.

Oxe is one of the UK's finest figurative artists while Wainwright is a landscape painter and Abergavenny-based Phillips' works are inspired by her local surroundings.
